



Sergio Pininfarina receives the “Torino Libera 2001” award

On Saturday May 5 in Palazzo Cisterna, Turin, Sergio Pininfarina’s status as an internationally renowned entrepreneur was recognised when he received the "Torino Libera 2001" award from the Centro Pannunzio, the cultural institution established by Arrigo Olivetti and Mario Soldati in 1968.

The “Torino Libera” award proposes to honour individuals, whose career has been a demonstration of that originality combined with an unswerving commitment to liberty that Mario Pannunzio ascribed to De Tocqueville.

Other recipients of the 2001 award along with Sergio Pininfarina were: Piero Bianucci, journalist and editor of La Stampa’s "Tuttoscienze" supplement; Antonino Brusca, cardiologist and university lecturer; Vittorio Chiusano, jurist and President of the Turin Criminal Court, Father Ruggero Cipolla, chaplan of Turin’s Prisons; Vittorio Mathieu, philosopher and university lecturer.
