

Pininfarina at the "Voitures X-Tremes" exhibition in Mulhouse with Osée and Nautilus

Pininfarina is showing the Citroën Osée and Peugeot Nautilus at the "Voitures Xtrèmes" exhibition from 26 October 2002 to 30 March 2003 at the Collection Schlumpf of the Musée National de l'Automobile in Mulhouse (France).

With "Voitures Xtrèmes – concept cars, voitures de rêve, voitures du futur", the Mulhouse Musée presents twenty years of motoring creations, featuring around thirty original prototypes which are a mixture of high tech and art.

This is the perfect setting for the Peugeot Nautilus (1997), an exciting stylistic exploration of the high class sporty saloon, created as a tribute to the partnership with Peugeot, and the Citroën Osée (2001), the first three-seater research prototype constructed on a Citroën chassis, developing the idea of a purely sporty car with a central engine, a first for the French manufacturer ("Best in Show" at the 2001 Geneva Motor Show).
